#### How to get here?

The dorms are next to our university and the address is: Esplanade des Arts et Métiers, 33400 Talence, France

By plane: Either you can fly directly to Bordeaux Airport and then use public transport to get to our university or you can fly to a Parisian airport and then buy a bus or train ticket to join Bordeaux (2h30 approximately). Be aware that Beauvais airport is not in Paris but 1h15 away from Paris in train.

By train: The main train station of Bordeaux is named Gare Saint-Jean. Once you reached it, you can join our university by using public transport.

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#### Public Transport


In Bordeaux you can either take the bus or the tramway.

If you come from the train station Gare Saint-Jean, you can take the tramway line D (or C it doesn't matter) to the stop "Quinconces" and then take the line B to "Arts et Métiers" (direction Pessac). An another option is to

take the bus n\*35 and stop at "Arts et Métiers".

If you come from Bordeaux Airport, you can take the tramway A and stop at "Hôpital Pellegrin" and then take the bus n\*8 (direction "Gradignan centre") until the stop "Arts et Métiers".

A bus/tramway ticket costs 1,80€ and can be bought at terminals next to bus/tramway stops.
